This year we are looking forward to sponsoring several 'freezie' and 'popcorn' days for the students, in addition to our annual 'Welcome Back to School' and 'Teacher Appreciation' luncheons. *Each of these luncheons includes both the school and church staffs. This is our way of saying "Thank You!" to all of those who dedicate their lives to our grandchildren.*

What do we do with your dues and other funds raised?

Each year we meet with SCB's principal Mary Schmidt to find out how we can best use our funds. We use her recommendations and grandparents' suggestions to decide how the club can make a positive impact on all of the SCB students. Last year, (2015-'16), we were able to

- purchase a badly needed new \$1,000 scanner for the school library
- donate \$300 toward costs of Sisterhood of the Souls middle school retreat
- donate \$600 toward costs for Missoula plays productions
- donate \$225 for the preschool's Trike-A-Thon Day bounce/maze
- give each teacher at least \$200 to fulfill a classroom 'wish'

(Because of special donations from some grandparents, we were able to give such large amounts!)
